Mounties hunt handbag gang

 RCMP officers are on the hunt for a gang of five who robbed their way into a woman's home, tied her up and stole thousands of dollars worth of designer handbags.

During the daylight robbery on June 26 in north Richmond, the victim suffered minor injuries but her handbag broke for 90 minutes after the home invasion.

During the hours and the dozens of calls to police, RCMP officers were alerted to the robbery on June 26 at 1:30 p.m., when the woman called on the phone to her mother in a residential neighborhood in the 7000 block of Park Road, just west of the Williams and Gilbert road intersection.
