Nearly 1,300 students from 19 local schools will be participating in the 10th annual Science Jam next Tuesday afternoon at Aberdeen Centre.

Billed as B.C.'s largest, non-competitive science fair, the annual exhibition of local scientists-inthe-making will be held from 4 to 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 26, and is part of Education Week.
