Aberdeen Centre's annual Chinese New Year celebration returns with a gold theme to bring in good luck and fortune.

The Richmond mall aims to bring luck to visitors with an abundance of giant gold coins and "golden cheese" displays for the Year of the Rat.

More festivities will take place at Aberdeen from Jan. 25 to 26 featuring a dragon and lion dance, Chinese music orchestra, and dance performances.
