5,000 Celebrate Beijing 2008 Olympics At Aberdeen Centre

Wow. They started lining up at 3:00 a.m., Friday, August 8, 2008 -- much to the surprise of the Aberdeen Centre guards. By 5:00 a.m., there were hundreds of people lining up for their free pancakes -- and the doors to Aberdeen Centre opened to displays, entertainment and a huge 28-foot video screen showing the opening ceremonies of the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics.

The event, jointly organized by Richmond Spirit of BC and Aberdeen Centre, was projected to have a maximum of 3,000 people, but people kept coming. By 7:00 a.m., about 5,000 people crammed in at all levels in Aberdeen Centre.

Highlights of the stage event included over 15 past and current Olympians from Richmond, an Olympic Fashion Show by The Bay, a dragon dance, terrific Asian dances, tai chi demonstration -- and greetings from the Mayor, who read out his proclamation celebrating the day, the Chinese Consul General, MP Raymond Chan and provincial minister Ida Chong.

Over 60 Richmond volunteers, from Richmond Spirit of BC, Richmond Chinese Community Society and Volunteer Richmond Information Services were on hand to make the event a resounding success.

The event had a host of media on hand with live broadcasts by Fairchild TV and Radio, CBC Radio, Global TV and CITY TV.
